**1187** applications received


In total, all 10 budget envelopes oversubscribed

Erasmus+ first credit mobility call



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## Best case scenario of budget use



## **Cooperation under Erasmus Mundus**

✓EMJMD (2014): 11 Joint Masters selected, one involving a Moroccan university as associate partner, 71 students from region selected for scholarships (of which 45 from Syria!, 0 from Libya)

✓EMJD (2014): 12 fellows from region selected (Egypt, Tunisia top)

Former EMMC and EMJD: Algeria, Israel and Lebanon involved as full partners in 6 EMMCs and 599 scholarships offered to students from the region (Egypt, Tunisia and Israel top), 147 scholars participated (Israel and Egypt top) and 15 fellows (Egypt, Jordan top)

✓Former EM Action 2 partnerships: 135 HEIs from region participated in the different partnerships.



### **Main achievements Tempus**

#### Staff development

important role in the professional development of staff in the region exposure to different perspectives and new insights into subject valuable work experience and further research opportunities breaking down hierarchies in region, involvement of women equal emphasis on non-academic staff

#### Curricular reform

new methods of designing and structuring courses based on 'learning outcomes' and ECTS credits and transferred know-how to region direct impact on introduction of three-cycle system in region development of joint/double degrees





### **Main achievements Tempus**

#### Links with labour market


involvement of local employers in curricular reform development of career centres, technology transfer offices and entrepreneurship hubs practical placements and graduate training programmes

#### Supporting reform at national level

tackling issues such as quality assurance, promoting entrepreneurship in education and reforming doctoral studies Particularly at regional level: leadership in HE, internationalisation, innovation through best practice and benchmarking promotion of Bologna transparency tools

### **Policy dialogue**

March 2011 Joint Communication "A partnership for democracy and shared prosperity with the Southern Mediterranean" and May 2011 Joint Communication "A new response to a changing Neighbourhood" stress that education should be a key focus of EU activities in the region; Value of exchanges at university level and the support of EU programmes to increase student and academic mobility and modernise higher education systems;

Despite different demographic situations, Europe and South Mediterranean have a common challenge: youth unemployment

Education and training policy makers have a major task in improving young people's employability.





### Policy dialogue (II)

- evaluate mismatches between the skills of young people and the expectations of potential employers
- present policies and programmes aimed at improving the employability of our young graduates and to exchange about policies developed at national and regional levels to improve their transition to the labour market
- development of enterpreneurship in higher education
- quality assurance and transparency tools





## Erasmus+ (2015-2020)

- ✓ Credit mobility for staff and students: 155 million € (approx. 26,000 mobility flows)
- ✓ Additional windows for EMJD: 17 million € (approx. 380 scholarships)
- ✓ Capacity Building for Higher Education with Special Mobility Strand: 172 million € (approx. 215 projects)
